## A Sample Transcript with CLEP Credits

The transcript below is designed to show how CLEP credits can be incorporated into the typical high school course pathway for the accelerated student. The sample shows a pathway to get 50+ CLEP credits for the super-motivated student who wants a lot of CLEP credits. Obviously, students can study for fewer credits or switch to community college courses in the $11^{\text {th }}$ or $12^{\text {th }}$ grades.

## The Honors Designation

On the sample, any course that could be supported by a CLEP exam was designated as "honors" except for Algebra which I preferred to call Advanced Algebra. My students took Algebra I in the $8^{\text {th }}$ grade and Algebra II in the $9^{\text {th }}$ grade and then took the College Algebra CLEP when it was convenient. I did not weight my students' grades for personal reasons. You can do that if necessary.

## CLEP List on Page 2 of Transcript

To showcase the CLEP credits earned, I included them in separate table on page 2 of the transcript. This format was acceptable to the colleges my kids applied to.

## $8^{\text {th }}$ Grade Credits on the Transcript

Adding $8^{\text {th }}$ grade credits to the high school transcript can benefit two different scenarios. First, the credits earned during $8^{\text {th }}$ grade can reduce the credit load each year of high school. If you want your student to earn 26-28 high school credits (6-7 credits per year) over four years, the $8^{\text {th }}$ grade credits can reduce the credit load for each year of high school. The "lighter" course load is an advantage when your student is studying college level material or wants to develop a skill or find employment.

The second scenario that $8^{\text {th }}$ grade credits can be of benefit is when a student wants to graduate early. Find out the lower limit of credits needed to graduate in your state. If it's 22 credits, your student can graduate during the $11^{\text {th }}$ grade year using $8^{\text {th }}$ grade credits. ## How to Decode the Sample Transcript

The sample transcript places traditional courses in the traditional slots. But the colors indicate when your student will actually take the courses. Green courses are taken in the $8^{\text {th }}$ grade; purple courses are taken in the $9^{\text {th }}$ grade; white courses are taken in the $10^{\text {th }}$ grade; orange courses are taken in the $11^{\text {th }}$ grade; yellow courses are taken in the $12^{\text {th }}$ grade.
